



Requirements

The Colleges of Arts & Sciences and Business have created an Interdisciplinary Minor in Global Political Economy. It will help you understand a wide range of global phenomena and their effects on an increasingly interdependent world, and equip you with knowledge and skills that will assist in obtaining employment and pursuing other educational opportunities.

The head of either the Department of Government (College of Arts & Sciences) or the Department of Economics and International Business (College of Business) may give certification of completion of the minor.

Students must pass 18 credits:

- 9 credits from the list of core courses (with 3 credits from each of 3 areas) and
- 9 credits from the list of electives.
- All courses must be passed with grades of C or higher.
- Arts & Sciences majors may not count S/U credits unless all grades in a course are automatically S/U.
- Courses:
 - Some courses may have prerequisites or require the consent of the instructor.
 - Appropriate Special Topics, Honors, subtitled Independent Studies Course, and/or an internship may be allowed for a maximum of 3 credits, subject to approval by the Department of either Government or Economics and International Business.
