At NMSU PGA Golf Management, student life is built on connection, collaboration, and opportunity, both inside the classroom and out on the course.

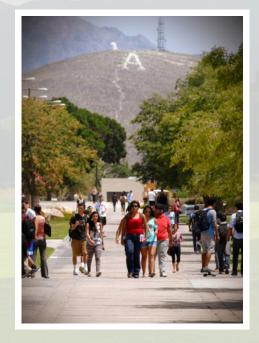

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW:

4½-Year Bachelor of Business Administration in Marketing with a PGA Golf Management Specialization

General Education & Business Core

• Students begin with a strong foundation in general education and business, including courses in accounting, finance, marketing, management, and communication—equipping them with essential skills to succeed in the golf industry.

PGA Golf Management Core Courses

• Through a series of specialized marketing courses (MKTG 180–481), students complete Levels 1–3 of the PGA's Professional Golf Management Program. Coursework includes subjects like Golf Operations, Turfgrass Management, Food & Beverage, Player Development, Teaching & Coaching, and Tournament Management.

Internship Experience

 All students complete 16 months of full-time, structured internships at golf facilities, associations, and PGA-related organizations. These experiences provide critical hands-on learning and real-world industry insight.

Playing Ability Test (P.A.T.) & PGA Certification

 Students are required to pass the PGA Playing Ability Test and complete all levels of the PGA Education Program. Upon graduation, students are eligible for PGA Membership and prepared to pursue careers across all sectors of the golf industry.

Upper-Division Electives & Capstone

 Advanced coursework in marketing and business strategy rounds out the program, culminating in a final experience that integrates academic knowledge with professional practice.

INTERNSHIPS:



16 MONTHS OF REAL-WORLD PREPARATION

Every student in the NMSU PGA Golf Management Program completes 16 months of full-time, paid internships as part of their journey to becoming a PGA Professional. These internships are more than just job placements. They are immersive, career-shaping experiences designed to launch students into the golf industry with confidence.

Students earn between \$16-\$20 per hour, with free housing provided at many sites. Our extensive network of opportunities spans the globe, including placements at top-100 golf facilities, PGA Section offices, destination resorts, private clubs, and even non-traditional roles like tournament operations, junior golf academies, and golf technology firms.

Before each internship, students go through a competitive application process, building résumés, preparing cover letters, and practicing interviews, thus gaining the professional skills and confidence

needed to thrive in the hiring process and the workplace.

Throughout their internship journey, students gain handson experience in diverse areas such as golf instruction, merchandising, event management, customer service, and facility operations. These rotations are tailored to individual career goals and often lead to long-term mentorship, job offers, and career clarity.

By the time they graduate, our students don't just have a degree. They have a professional résumé, a network of industry connections, and the real-world experience to step confidently into leadership roles within the golf industry.





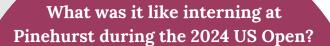

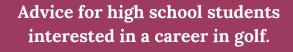

TRACKMAN STUDIO:



ELEVATING PLAYER & COACH DEVELOPMENT

Our state-of-the-art TrackMan Teaching Lab is the centerpiece of player development at NMSU PGA Golf Management. This indoor performance studio features the industry's most advanced technology, giving students the tools to analyze, improve, and coach the game at the highest level.

The facility is equipped with:

- Two TrackMan 4 simulators for ball flight tracking, swing data, and virtual golf
- Sportsbox AI 3D motion analysis for precise biomechanical feedback
- BodiTrak pressure mapping to assess weight shift and balance
- High-speed video analysis systems for frame-by-frame swing review

Students can reserve the lab for a variety of uses, including individual practice, virtual rounds, club fittings, and peer-to-peer or supervised instruction.

Whether preparing for the PAT or learning how to coach others, the lab provides hands-on experience with the same tools used by top instructors and tour professionals around the world.

More than just a place to practice, the TrackMan Lab is where students become true professionals, learning to use data, technology, and coaching insight to elevate performance and drive results.









TOURNAMENT PROGRAM:

At NMSU PGA Golf Management, our tournament program is a cornerstone of student development, designed to prepare students for the PGA Playing Ability Test (PAT) and build competitive confidence throughout their time in the program.

Each student is required to play in a minimum of four tournaments per academic year, with over 40 PGA-sanctioned events hosted annually. These events take place at top local venues, including the NMSU Golf Course, Sonoma Ranch, and Red Hawk Golf Club. They offer students a wide range of competitive formats, from stroke play and match play to skills challenges and team events.

The program pays out over \$100,000 annually in scholarships, prize money, and gift certificates, creating meaningful incentives for performance and participation. Optional passes such as the Ultimate Tournament Pass allow access to all events, including side games like skins

and par-3 challenges.

Tournaments are also used to monitor playing ability and support student development, with one-on-one coaching and personalized plans available for students working to pass the PAT. This structured and supportive environment helps students build tournament experience, handle pressure, and sharpen their games.

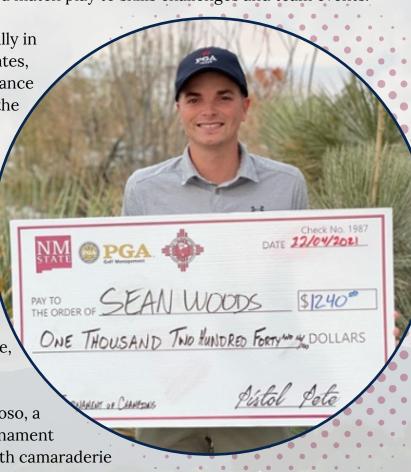
Each semester, students also travel to Ruidoso, a nearby mountain town, for a weekend tournament getaway that combines competitive play with camaraderie

and a refreshing change of scenery.

In addition to local events, our top players represent NMSU in prestigious regional and national tournaments such as the PGA University Championship, the Kelbel Cup, and the GMG Cup, showcasing their skills and school pride on a larger stage.

For many, the tournament program is where competitive fire meets professional preparation, which is an essential step in becoming a confident, capable PGA Professional.







Competing Beyond Campus

Top performers in our tournament program have the opportunity to represent NMSU on a larger stage by qualifying for prestigious regional and national events. Students compete in the PGA University Championship, a showcase of the best PGM programs in the country; the Kelbel Cup, a regional competition that blends camaraderie with high-level play; and the GMG Cup, a spirited team match-play event. These events offer unforgettable experiences and a chance to proudly represent NMSU against the best in collegiate golf management.

COACHING

Led by Henry Stetina, a four-time Teacher of the Year and Golf Digest's #1 Teacher in New Mexico, our coaching blends Strokes Gained analytics, DECADE course strategy, and mental game training to drive measurable improvement. Students meet regularly for performance reviews, goal setting, and tailored practice plans; developing smarter, more consistent players.



LESSONS

Individual lessons use TrackMan 4, Sportsbox AI, BodiTrak, and video analysis to fine-tune mechanics and elevate scoring. Every session ends with a clear action plan tied to Strokes Gained stats, helping students understand where they lose shots and how to gain them back.

DEVELOPMENT

Our long-term development model includes performance tracking, seasonal training phases, and custom practice plans to help players break 80, 75, and 70. With support in fitness, nutrition, and tournament prep, students follow a clear pathway that turns data into results and potential into performance.

At NMSU PGA Golf Management, career development is at the core of everything we do. We're proud to uphold a 100% job placement rate, not only for required internships but also for full-time positions after graduation.

Every student completes 16 months of paid, career-shaping internships, working at top facilities across the U.S. and abroad. These include top-100 golf courses, private clubs, resort destinations, PGA Section offices, and other notable locations. Many students receive job offers before graduation, thanks to the depth of their experience and preparation.

From day one, students receive personal guidance in résumé writing, interview preparation, and career planning. Our faculty and staff work directly with students to match them with internship opportunities aligned with their goals, whether it's becoming a head professional, general

manager, director of instruction, or even launching their own business.

PLAYING GOLF:



A GOLFER'S PARADISE: YEAR-ROUND PLAY IN LAS CRUCES

Located in the heart of southern New Mexico, Las Cruces offers ideal conditions for year-round golf—with over 300 days of sunshine annually and mild seasonal temperatures that rarely disrupt play. Winters are cool but comfortable, with average highs in the 50s and 60s, while spring and fall bring perfect golfing weather in the 70s and 80s. Even in the summer, dry heat and early tee times make golf a daily reality.

Students have access to three high-quality public golf courses within 15 minutes of campus:

- NMSU Golf Course, owned and operated by the university
- Red Hawk Golf Club, a championship public course
- Sonoma Ranch Golf Course, neighborhood course with fast greens

For just a few hundred dollars per semester, students can purchase unlimited play passes at any or all of these facilities, with cart fees and range balls included. These passes provide full access to practice

Tuition & Housing

- In-State Tuition: Available to most students after the first year through residency or scholarship programs.
- <u>Out-of-State Discounts:</u> Many students qualify for reduced tuition through the Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE), Competitive Scholarships, or Regional Reciprocity Agreements with neighboring states.
- On-Campus <u>Housing & Meal Plans</u>: Required for first-year students, with PGA Golf Management students encouraged to live in the PGM Living Learning Community.

LAB FEES FOR PGA GOLF MANAGEMENT PROGRAM COURSES:

Many of the required PGA classes have a required lab fee. The lab fee will appear along with your tuition each semester that a PGA Golf Management course is registered for. The lab fees cover all expenses related to the PGA Educational Program, all required supplemental materials for each class, your first attempt of the PGA's Playing Ability Test, and guest speakers.

PGA GOLF MANAGEMENT PROGRAM DESIGNATION

Students who successfully complete the entire PGA Golf Management Program requirements will receive a special "PGA Designation" on their official transcript. To receive this designation and graduate from the NMSU PGA Golf Management Program, the following are required:

- Complete the entire 120 credit hour curriculum
- Complete at least 16 months of Co-op (internship) Education
- Complete the PGA's Education Program (Q-Level, Levels 1-3)
- Successfully pass the PGA's Playing Ability Test (P.A.T.)







HOW TO APPLY:

Step 1: Apply to New Mexico State University

<u>Click here</u> to complete the undergraduate admissions application. Be sure to submit your high school transcripts, test scores (if applicable), and any required documents.

Step 2: Apply to the PGA Golf Management Program

To be eligible, you must have a golf handicap index of 12.0 or lower. You can verify this by:

- Submitting an official GHIN or USGA handicap,
- Having a PGA Professional or high school coach sign your verification form, or
- Providing proof of passing the PGA Playing Ability Test (PAT), if already completed.

Step 4: Receive Admission Decision

Once your application and handicap verification are submitted, our program staff will review your file. You will receive a letter by mail with your admission decision.

Step 5: Confirm Your Spot

If accepted, complete and return the confirmation form included in your acceptance packet. This secures your place in the incoming class.

Step 6: Plan Your Visit (Optional, But Encouraged)

Schedule a personalized campus visit to tour the facilities, meet our staff, and even play a round of golf. Contact our office directly to arrange your trip and we'll take care of the details.

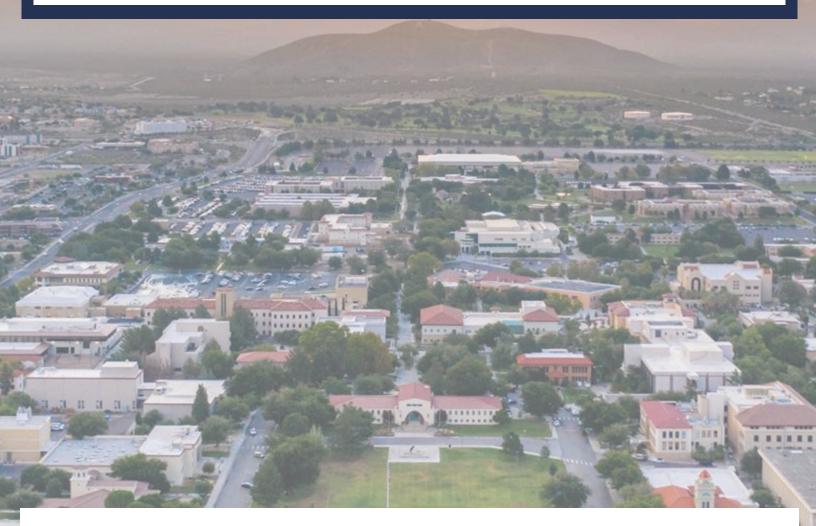
