Cyber Threats to Critical Infrastructure:

An effective cyberattack on a regional power grid could interrupt essential services and cause secondary effects including interruptions to telecom, water and waste water sectors, transportation gridlock and supply chain disruptions. Such an attack could bring a region's economy to a halt. As information sharing and partnering are key to effective cyber security, the panel will discuss the means by which threat information is shared between government and industry, as well as between critical infrastructure sectors. Panelists will also discuss what actions are being taken to secure critical infrastructure network from cyberattacks.

Integrated Resource Planning in an Era of Electricity Transformation:

The fundamental goal of integrated resource planning is to develop a least-cost portfolio of electric power resources – both supply and demand side – that can be used to reliably meet expected peak customer electricity demand, plus a planning reserve margin over a specified time period. As the electricity transformation continues, this process becomes increasingly complex, with each geographic region facing different circumstances, opportunities, and challenges. This panel will explore these developments through the lens of Commissioners, independent system operators, consumers, and utilities, using EPRI's Integrated Energy Network – Planning Framework (IEN-P) as the technical foundation. IEN-P describes how traditional electric sector resource planning will need to evolve so that electric stakeholders can effectively benefit from new opportunities. IEN-P also communicates the strong need for increased communication and coordination along the electricity supply chain and among the multiple stakeholders that are becoming more interdependent with the electric sector.

As the Grid Grows: Market Solutions and Approaches to Regional Reliability

The panel will explore the dynamics of electric grid reliability/resiliency with a particular focus on differing regional challenges and potential solutions from a market perspective. Given recent attention on fuel portfolios and subsidies, as well as the future of competitive markets, panelists will discuss how to define fuel security, reliability and resiliency. The panel will explore regional challenges and how market solutions may provide better outcomes than federal intervention. Questions to be explored include what attributes of fuels should be valued and priced into markets to preserve competitive market structures and what investments are needed? Panelists may delve into tension between state and federal policy over generation decisions and how to balance the impacts of any policies to avoid distortion of competitive markets.

The Transformation of Universal Service to Broadband – Phase II

The nation's policy shift from voice service to universal broadband is changing the landscape, both in terms of what services are funded and who is receiving federal USF support. In addition, we have seen several states take actions to fill remaining gaps. This panel will analyze the distribution of benefits from the \$150 million/year CAF II auction, as well as recent efforts by a variety of states to stabilize and/or expand state USF funds as they transition support to broadband.

Renewable Energy & Economic Development

The growing demand for renewable energy by commercial, industrial and municipal customers is playing out in traditional regulatory constructs as well as new scenarios. A number of Fortune 500 companies have publicly committed to investing in clean energy, citing the need for reducing both carbon pollution and energy costs. New commercial and/or industrial facilities can translate into significant economic development possibilities for a state, but are hinged on the availability of renewable energy among other factors. Panelists will explore how to navigate existing state regulatory environments and what is needed in terms of state policy or regulatory change to foster such growth. Are utilities and their customers seeking changes to tariffs, better interconnection standards, and/or direct access? Panelists will discuss the demand for more renewable energy and its potential impact on utilities, consumers, regulators and state economic development officials.
